

We extended our efforts to four provinces: Bagmati, Gandaki, Lumbini, and Karnali, amplifying our impact across Nepal.



Engaged 1367 individuals through our Prevention of Internal Human Trafficking

Project in Kaski and Kathmandu with OVN.



Reached 13182 individuals through our Prevention of Cross-Border Anti Human Trafficking Project in Rupandehi with OVN.



Extended support to 145
Nepalese individuals during the rescue and repatriation process from India through a cross-border initiative with KIN India and Good Shepherd Convent Bombay Society.

Provided counseling, information on Safe Migration and facilitated Cadaver vehicle service to 46157 migrant workers and their families and engaged with 382 stakeholder representatives through the Prevention of Unsafe Migration Project with NNSM in Kathmandu.





## 255 stakeholders

(parliamentarians, academicians, researchers, child centric, girls group leaders) were intensely engaged in the development of Policy Paper of empowerment, engagement and education of girls (3E girls in Nepal) with Consortium Nepal.





144 stakeholders, parliamentarians, human right activist, CSOs representatives were engaged in the advocacy for domestication of Palermo Protocol with AATWIN Nepal. Palermo Protocol booklets in English and Nepali language were developed and published.





Reached to 116 girls and women, formed an alliance in Karnali province and provided emergency support to the youth with WWPU.

online safety through our MultiCongregation Project, fostering
education and awareness in seven
discrict with Child Safe Net.

Assisted 150 families in Jajarkot with temporary shelters, ensuring safety and security after devastating Earthquake.

International Tribunal on Eviction and




