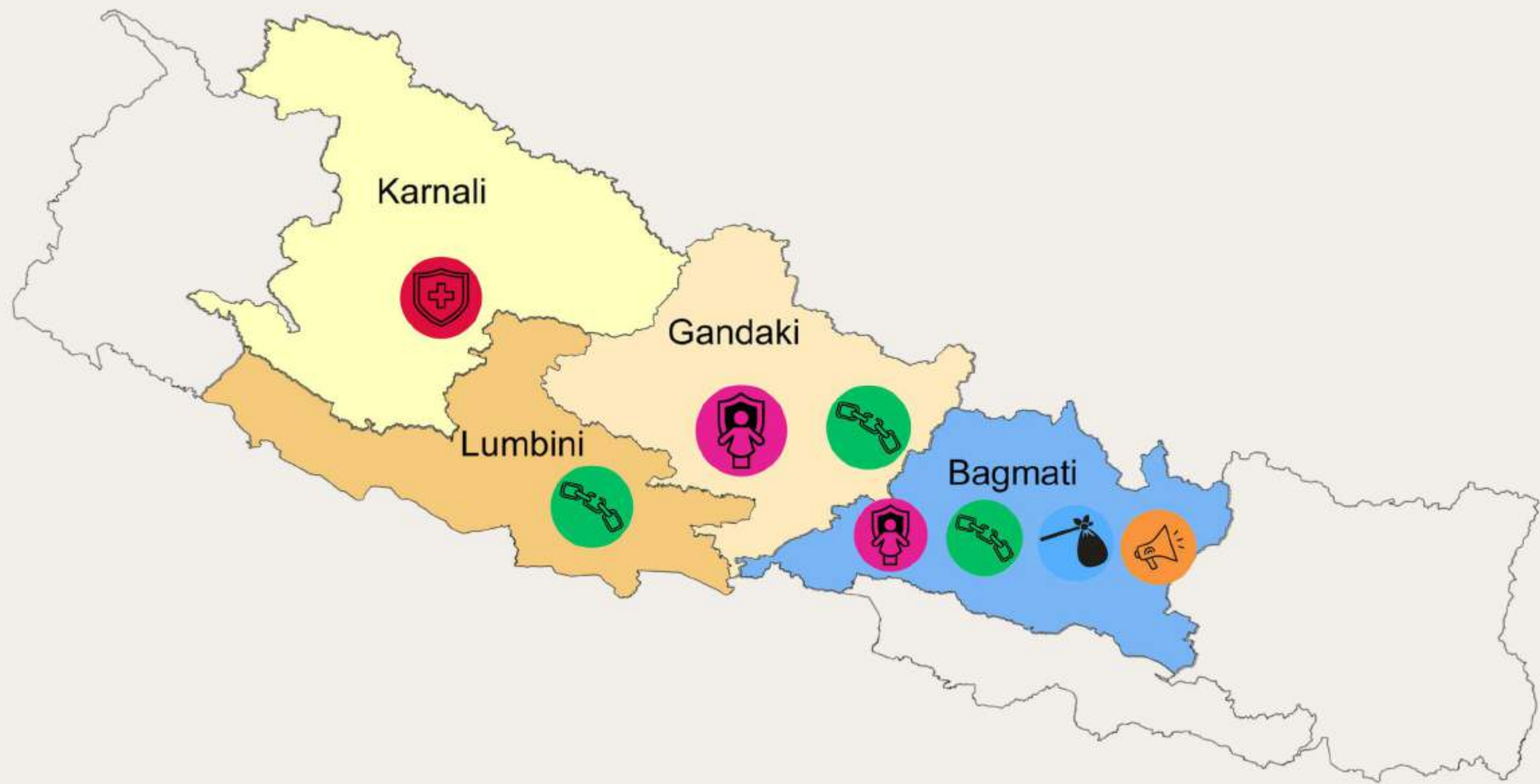

NNSM in Kathmandu.**

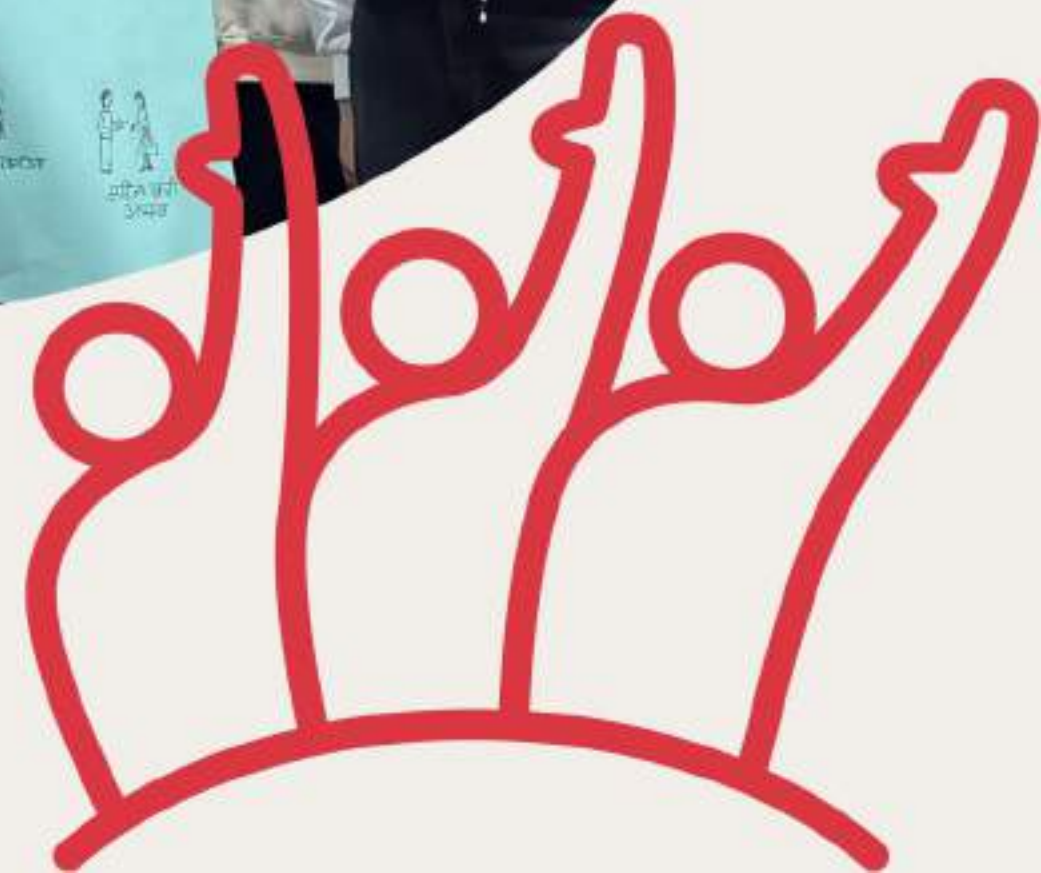

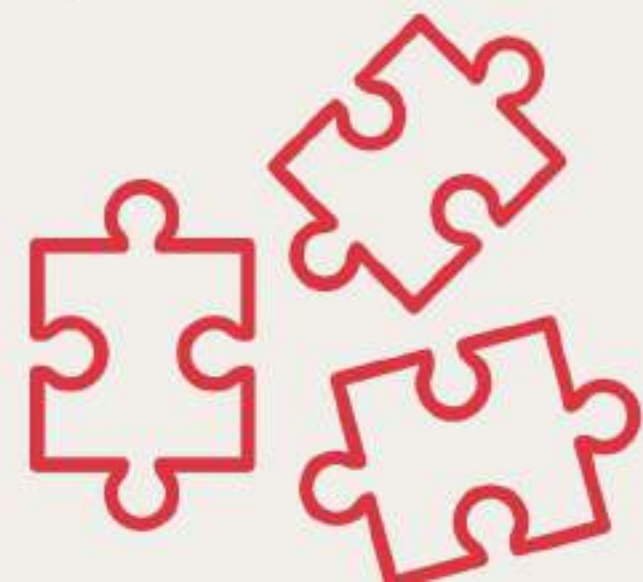


255 stakeholders

Consortium Nepal.



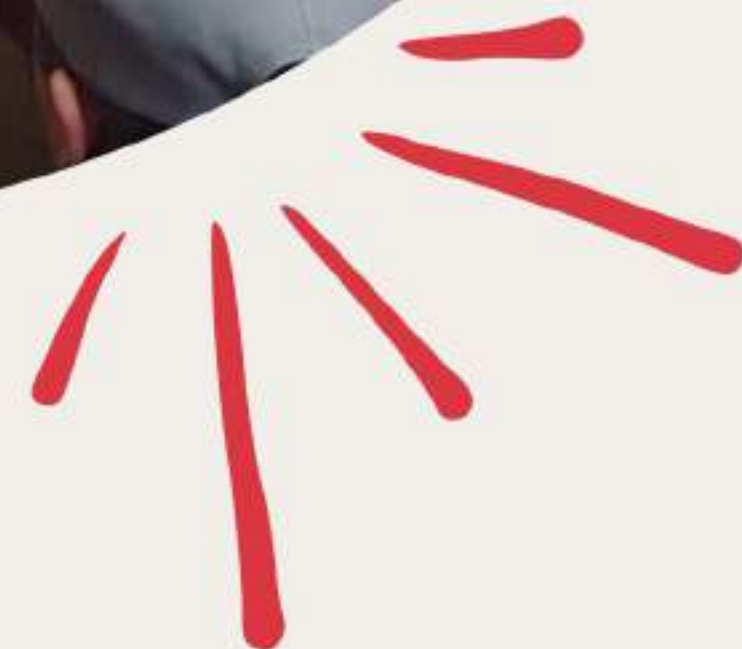

after devastating Earthquake.**



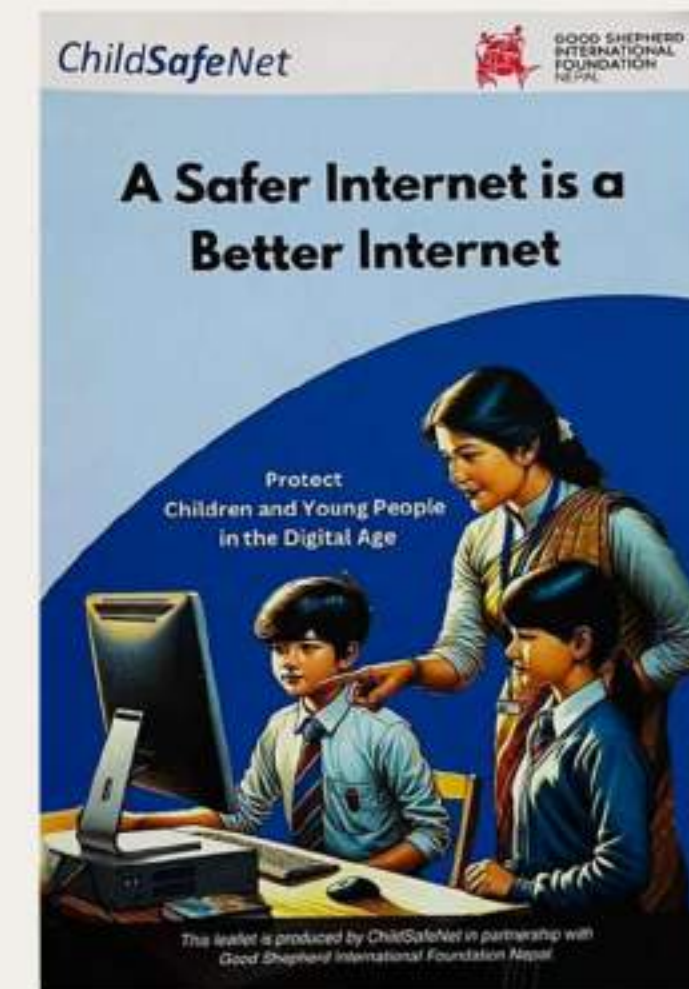
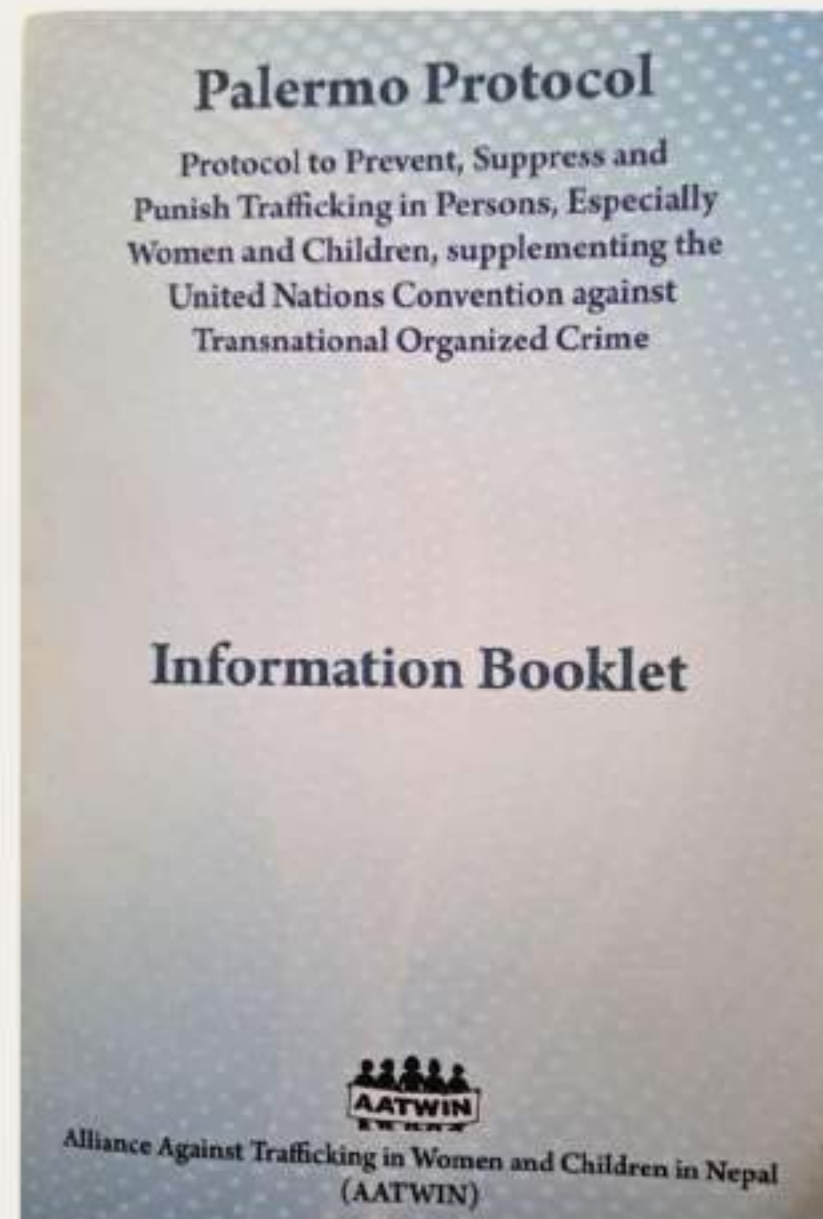
